

## LETTERS OF TRANSMITTAL

SIR: I have the honor to transmit herewith certain preliminary data for the immediate use of the Senate in partial response to the requirements of Senate Resolution No. 156, for information on depreciated currencies and international trade thereunder.

These preliminary data consist of tables pertaining to imports into the United States during the months since currency depreciation in foreign countries set in, in comparison with previous months, together with a very brief explanatory text. Where available, quantities and average unit values are shown. In most cases the data are carried down to March, 1932, but for some of the items March statistics are not yet available. Certain averages are presented for the 5-month period October, 1931, to February, 1932, in comparison with previous periods.

In addition to the effects of depreciated currency on imports and exports, the Senate resolution asks for the ad valorem equivalents of specific duties under the tariff act of 1930, as of June 18, 1930, and as of April 1, 1932. Data for April 1 (necessarily represented by the monthly totals for March, 1932) have only just become available and are in process of tabulation. These data will shortly be submitted to the Senate. The commission some time ago noted the importance of the effect of the decline in prices on the ad valorem equivalents of specific rates of duty and undertook a study on that subject based on the imports of the period October, 1930-September, 1931, as compared with the calendar year 1929, this being part of a general analysis of the ad valorem equivalent of all rates of duty during these periods.

The data relating to monthly imports submitted herewith are preliminary and subject to revision as well as to possible further analysis and discussion by the commission.

## SUMMARY OF IMPORT STATISTICS

### Extent of currency depreciation.

Table 1 of this report shows the rates of exchange of the principal countries whose currency has recently fallen in exchange value as compared with the dollar. The table shows that there is a certain degree of uniformity among the several countries with respect to the time at which the recent decline in exchange began and the extent of the decline. For most countries the decline began in the latter part of September, 1931. For most countries the drop has ranged from 20 to 30 per cent. For most countries the greater part of the total decline occurred between September and December and the exchange since that time has been more stable, in some cases having risen appreciably, notably in the case of the pound sterling. In considering the relation of exchange depreciation to imports into the United States, attention is called particularly to the fact that the Japanese exchange did not decline until about the middle of December and the fall could hardly have had any effect on imports before some time in January.

### Total value of imports.

Table 2 shows the total value of imports into the United States from the principal countries, distinguishing those with depreciated currency and those on the gold standard. Comparison is made between the monthly average imports during the period October, 1931–February, 1932, and the corresponding period of 1930–31, and also between the period January–September, 1931, when the exchange of most of the countries was still stable, and the corresponding period of 1930. As pointed out in the accompanying memorandum, these values do not serve as a measure of the quantitative changes in imports, because of the decline in prices. Moreover, it is possible that since depreciation has set in, the decline in the prices of products imported into the United States from the depreciated currency countries, expressed in terms of dollars, may have been greater than the decline in the prices of imports from countries on the gold standard.

The table shows that from six leading European countries which were off the gold standard, the imports into the United States during the period October to February were, in terms of dollars, 72 per cent of the imports during the corresponding period of 1930–31 (that is, a decline of 28 per cent). For imports from the six leading European countries which are on the gold standard, the corresponding ratio was 77 per cent, the decrease thus being less marked than in the case of the countries off the gold standard. The decline in the value of imports from the European countries off the gold standard for the October–February period was somewhat less, in percentage, than the decline for January to September, 1931, before depreciation set in, as compared with the same period of 1930; the same was also true

in more marked degree of the European countries on the gold standard. The imports from the leading non-European countries off the gold standard during the October–February period were in dollar value 69 per cent of the figure for the same months of 1930–31, a decline of 31 per cent. The corresponding ratio for the leading non-European countries on the gold standard was 72 per cent, the relative decline thus being somewhat less. In the case of the countries off the gold standard, this decline for the October–February period was appreciably less marked than that for the January–September period, but for the countries on the gold standard the decline was a little more marked for the later period than for the period preceding depreciation.

Broadly speaking, the table shows relatively little difference between the countries on the gold standard and those off the gold standard with respect to the changes in the total value of imports into the United States.

**Changes in imports of leading individual commodities (quantities where available).**

Table 4 shows for each of 226 important commodities the relation between the imports for October, 1931, to February, 1932, and those of the corresponding period of 1930–31; and also a comparison between January–September, 1931, and the corresponding period of 1930. The data are based on quantities, so far as available, rather than values. They are in the form of relative numbers, showing the ratio, as a percentage, which the imports of the given period bore to those of the corresponding previous period.

This table is summarized in Tables A to D below, which consist of a count of the number of items showing changes of the character stated, and of totals of the values of imports, in 1931, of these items.

Table A shows the number of items classified according to the nature of the changes for the period October, 1931, to February, 1932, from the corresponding period one year earlier. The commodities are thrown into three groups in order to facilitate comparison between movements of commodities chiefly imported from depreciated currency countries and those of other commodities. A list of the commodities falling under each item of the count is shown in Table E at the end of this summary.

Of the 226 commodities covered by this tabulation, 99 are imported chiefly from countries with depreciated currency (Group I), 59 chiefly from countries on the gold standard (Group II), and in the case of 68 the imports are neither predominantly from depreciated-currency countries nor predominantly from gold-standard countries (Group III).

Of the 99 commodities of Group I, 35 (subgroups A and B) show an increase for October, 1931–February, 1932, over the corresponding period of 1930–31, the increase being marked in the case of about half of these. Among the commodities imported chiefly from gold-standard countries, the proportion which showed similar increases was somewhat higher, but in the case of commodities of Group III the proportion was somewhat lower.

At the other end of the scale are the commodities of which the imports declined considerably or markedly. Among the 99 coming chiefly from depreciated-currency countries, 23 showed a considerable decline in October–February as compared with the same period of the preceding year, and 24 a marked decline. The declines were relatively somewhat less numerous in the case of commodities of Group II, but somewhat more numerous among those of Group III.

Table B is similar to Table A except that it indicates the relative importance of the items under each heading as measured by the value of imports during the calendar year 1931.

This table is in some respects less significant than Table A for the reason that a very few large items may greatly affect the totals in the given subgroups. The most important point to be noted is the fact that under Group I the commodities showing a considerable decrease (subgroup D) which represented not far from half of the total for the group in value, consist largely of four major items, namely, newsprint paper, crude petroleum, gasoline, and burlaps. The value of the imports of each of these four in 1931 was greater than that of any other of the 226 commodities covered by the table. The total value of the imports of these four was \$215,217,000. If this be de-

ducted from the total for items showing a considerable decrease, the remainder is \$37,763,000. Percentages are shown in the table both on the basis of the totals including these four items and on the basis of totals with these items excluded. When this adjustment is made the relationships of the several percentages of value for the three groups of commodities are not widely different from the relationships shown by the table dealing with number of items, although naturally a considerable disparity is to be expected. Taking the two tables together it seems evident that, as regards the changes shown in the imports during the period October–February as compared with the same period one year earlier, no definite difference can be traced between the commodities coming chiefly from depreciated currency countries and those coming from other countries.

In the case of a considerable number of commodities it is not possible to compare the change in imports for the October–February period with the change for the January–September period for the reason that data are not available for January–September, 1930, because of changes in classification made by the tariff act of 1930. Disregarding these cases, significant relations appear between the two sets of comparisons; these are summarized in Tables C and D.

Table C, relating to the number of items, shows that in the case of the articles of Group I (coming chiefly from the depreciated-currency countries) in which an increase occurred for the period October-February over the same period one year earlier (subgroups A and B), nearly all made also a relative gain (that is, either the increase was greater, in percentage, than that for the January-September period of 1931 as compared with 1930, or the January-September period had shown a decrease). The same, however, was also true of the commodities imported chiefly from gold-standard countries and likewise, though in less marked degree, of the commodities of Group III.

Of the 41 commodities of Group I which showed a considerable or marked decrease for the October-February period from the same period one year earlier, this decrease in the case of 11 was less marked than that shown by the January-September period, there thus being a relative gain. The number in which there was both an absolute and a relative loss was 16.

Of the total of 82 commodities listed in Table C as coming chiefly from depreciated-currency countries, there were 46 (or 56 per cent of the total number) which made a relative gain for the October-February period as compared with the change which had taken place for the January-September period—that is to say, there was either a greater increase, or a smaller decrease, or a change from decrease to increase. On the other hand, 17 items suffered a relative loss. Of the 46 commodities imported chiefly from gold-standard countries, 30 (or 67 per cent of the total number) show a relative gain, and 11 a relative loss; and of the 62 commodities falling under Group III, 35 made a relative gain and 16 a relative loss. In each group there were some commodities with little difference as between the two periods with respect to the increases or decreases in quantity of imports.

Table D corresponds to Table C but deals with the value of the imports during 1931 of the commodities which fall into the several classifications with respect to the relation of the changes for the October-February period to the changes for the January-September period.

The figures for Group I of this table, as in Table B, are greatly affected by the four large items, newsprint paper, crude petroleum, gasoline, and jute burlaps, all of which fall in the same category as regards both absolute and relative change; that is to say, for all four of these the imports from October to February showed a considerable decrease from the same period one year earlier, and at the same time showed little relative change, there having been substantially the same decrease during the January-September period. If the imports of these four articles are excluded from the table, the proportion of the total value of commodities of Group I falling under the heading D 2 is reduced from 44.9 per cent to about 3 per cent, and all the other percentages for Group I become materially larger.

Although even after this adjustment considerable variations in detail appear among Groups I, II, and III in the percentage distribution of the imports falling under the several classifications, nevertheless the value figures, taken in conjunction with those of number of items in Table C, fail to show any distinct difference among commodities of the three groups with respect to the relationship between the increases and decreases for the October-February period and the increases and decreases for the January-September period.

This large figure is due to the great magnitude of four items—burlaps, newsprint paper, crude petroleum, and gasoline. Adjusted percentages excluding these items are shown in the last column.

In considering these absolute and relative changes in imports of individual commodities, it is important to take into consideration the relation of the total amount of imports to the total production of the commodity in the United States, and also the relation of recent imports to the imports of a more normal period of time, such as 1929. For example, among the commodities which come chiefly from Group I countries, the imports of butter, which show a marked increase for the period October–February over the same period one year earlier, and the imports of cream and milk, which show a marked decrease, are small in comparison with the domestic production. On the other hand, the imports of flaxseed and of cattle hides, which show an increase, and the imports of carpet wool, of pulpwoods, and of asbestos, which show a decrease, are normally much larger in comparison with domestic production.

## **MEMORANDUM REGARDING COMPARISON OF QUANTITY AND VALUE OF IMPORTS INTO THE UNITED STATES AS Affected BY CURRENCY DEPRECIATION**

---

### **Period of time affected by depreciation.**

1. In considering the effect of currency depreciation on imports into the United States, the date at which depreciation set in in the several countries and the extent of the depreciation must be taken into consideration. Table 1 furnishes the data on these points.

2. In the case of most countries the depreciation began in the latter part of September, 1931, the currency having previously either been practically at par, or, as in the case of Spain and certain other countries, having been substantially stable at a level below the nominal par. Table 1 measures the depreciation in the case of such countries, by relatives showing the decline, either from par or from such stabilized exchange value.

3. The effect of the depreciation which began in the latter part of September could not appear before October, and on account of the time factor in negotiating purchases and in transportation the imports during much of the month of October could not have been affected, except in the case of imports from North American countries. It should be noted in this connection that because of the general business depression which had prevailed for some time before in foreign countries, it is probable that few foreign producers, when depreciation began, possessed large inventories of commodities ready for immediate export.

4. In the case of countries on the silver standard, exchange has fluctuated, with a general downward trend, for some years past, but there has been an exceptionally marked downward trend in recent months. In such cases the measure of this recent depreciation is taken by comparison with the average rate of exchange in 1930, and the beginning of the special depreciation is in the statistical tables treated as with the month of October.

5. In Mexico, which went legally from the gold standard to the silver standard in July, 1931, depreciation is treated as beginning on August 1. For Japan depreciation began about the middle of December and in the statistics of imports the depreciation period is treated as beginning with January, 1932.

### **Total value of imports from principal countries.**

6. Tables 2 and 3 deal with the total value of imports from the principal countries, comparing those with depreciated currency with those on the gold standard. It should be remembered that in general the prices of import commodities, both from depreciated-currency countries and other countries, have been falling so that the value figures do not reflect equally great quantitative declines. It should be noted, also, that the values shown are the result of converting prices in foreign currency into United States dollars, using the rate of exchange current at the time of their importation. To whatever extent the prices of commodities imported from countries with depreciated currency, when converted to United States dollars, may have declined

more than the prices, similarly converted, of commodities imported from countries on the gold standard, this comparison of total value of imports may fail to reflect the relative quantitative changes in the imports from these two classes of countries. There is no way of measuring at all closely how much average unit prices for commodities imported from a given country, all taken together, have declined, or of comparing at all precisely depreciated-currency countries with other countries in this respect.

#### Total imports of 226 commodities.

7. In order, so far as possible, to eliminate the effect of changes in prices, whether due to depreciation of the currency or to other causes, Tables 4-9, inclusive, deal for the most part with the quantity of commodities imported, the average unit values being also shown. For some commodities, however, quantities are not reported, or vary so greatly from time to time in grade and type that they can not properly be used; in such cases values are shown in these tables.

8. Tables 4, 5, and 6 deal with total imports from all countries combined of 226 commodities (the clerical labor involved in presenting the monthly data for each principal country for so large a number of commodities would have required more time than was available). The list includes most of the leading import commodities which are competitive with American products, and a limited number which are not in any considerable degree competitive.

This list of 226 commodities was selected early in the study of depreciated exchange, which was begun by the commission some months before the passage of Senate Resolution 156. The selection was made with a view to throwing light upon the question of the effect of depreciated exchange upon imports and as many commodities were included as was practicable in view of the large amount of clerical work involved. The following were the guiding principles in the selection of these commodities:

(a) To include a very large proportion of all articles of any considerable magnitude which are competitive with domestic products and the imports of which are predominantly from countries with currency now depreciated; the representation of articles imported chiefly from gold-standard countries, or partly from depreciated-currency and partly from gold-standard countries, was not made so complete.

(b) To include representation of each of the 11 main groups and 88 subgroups into which commodities are classified in the import statistics (as far as there are imports of some importance under these groups or subgroups which are competitive with domestic products); i. e., many items were included which although relatively small as compared with the total for all imports were of importance among the items in the particular group or subgroup.

(c) To prefer, in general, the selection of articles for which quantities are given in official statistics and which are standardized to such a degree that the changes in these quantities would have significance. In some cases quantitative changes are entirely misleading because of variations in the character of the product, and for the most part items of this sort were omitted. It was necessary, however, to include some items on the value basis only, in order to have representation of important fields of trade. This emphasis on commodities with quantitative data was considered the more necessary by reason of the

fact that analysis was to be made of the changes in average unit value as well as in quantity.

(d) To include a limited number of representative articles which are scarcely, if at all, competitive with domestic products, in order to form a basis for judging the relation of changes in such articles to those in competitive commodities.

9. Some of these 226 commodities are imported (I) chiefly from countries whose currency is now depreciated, (II) some chiefly from countries which are on the gold standard, and (III) for still others imports are more evenly divided among depreciated-currency and gold-standard countries. The distinction between these three classes of imports is maintained throughout Tables 4, 5, and 6; it is obviously important to compare imports of Group I with those of Groups II and III. In Table 6 articles of which 75 per cent or more (in value) of the imports in 1931 came from countries whose currency is now depreciated are indicated by the abbreviation "Dep."; those of which 75 per cent or more came from gold-standard countries are indicated by the word "Gold"; other articles are marked "Mixed."

10. In these tables certain comparisons are made for the period from October, 1931, to February, 1932 (with adjustments to other periods of time in the case of Japan and Mexico). Because of the seasonal character of the imports of many commodities, comparisons are not drawn between this period of five months and the immediately preceding period. They are drawn rather with the period October, 1930, to February, 1931. This comparison, standing alone, however, might be misleading by reason of the general downward trend of import trade and of prices; it is therefore set over against a comparison between the period January to September, 1931, and the same period of 1930.

11. The changes in quantities, and in average unit values, are for some commodities more or less misleading by reason of variations from month to month in the character of the commodity as regards grades, styles, and country of origin. In other words, while many of the commodities covered are of a fairly standardized character, others are much less standardized. In a few cases, although the official reports show quantities as well as values, the values only are presented in these tables by reason of the almost complete lack of standardization. Footnotes call attention to certain other commodities in which this factor of variation in character is of particular importance, but even where notes do not appear there may be some such variation. In the case of a limited number, especially agricultural and fishery products, price variations, as well as quantity variations, are affected by seasonal influences.

#### **Imports of major commodities by countries.**

12. Tables 7, 8, and 9 deal with the imports of major commodities by countries of origin, distinction being made between countries with depreciated currencies and those on the gold standard. The comparisons are on the same principle as those of Tables 4, 5, and 6. What has been said in paragraph 11 with regard to the variability of certain commodities applies also to these tables by countries; in certain cases the character of the goods coming from one country may be different from that of the goods coming from another country, and the character of those coming from the same country may also vary from time to time.




































