Hospice is so much more than what many are aware of. It includes services of physician visits,

RN/LVN, social workers, spiritual counselors, certified home health aides and volunteers. It also entails

medication, treatments, supplies, equipment and 24 hour triage support by trained staff. If you are the

patient or family member which service would you want to be cut back or removed.

Our right to choose is of primary importance whether old or young, healthy or ill.

If the hospices are forced to reduce services to keep the companies afloat or stipulations are set forth as

to when a company is able to bill or when will it be paid the public will be very much affected.

Please consider this very carefully and continue to support the fee for service Medicare plan.
