OPENING STATEMENT OF HON. RON WYDEN, A U.S. SENATOR FROM
 OREGON, CHAIRMAN, COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

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The Chairman. This meeting will come to order. Today we meet to consider two pending nominations of Maria Louise Lago and Lisa Wang to take on important roles at the Commerce Department.

8 This morning we have a lot of committees here in the 9 Senate conducting business, and certainly we have a lot 10 of Finance members with challenging schedules today.

We had some consultations with our friend, Ranking Member Senator Crapo, and here is how we are going to proceed. We will use this time to make statements about the nominees. I will make a short statement, followed by Senator Crapo, and followed by any other Finance members who would like to make statements.

At that point, we intend to recess until the next roll call vote on the Senate floor, when the committee will reconvene in the President's Room off the floor to have the vote, if that is acceptable. The vote is expected at 11:30 a.m., and I believe that is acceptable to my colleague, Senator Crapo.

23 So, our first nominee will be Marisa Lago, who is 24 nominated to serve as Under Secretary of Commerce for 25 International Trade. Once confirmed, she would head up

the International Trade Administration. This is a job with big responsibilities: enforcement of trade laws to protect and create American jobs, breaking down barriers to our exports, and leveling the playing field for small and medium-sized businesses.

6 Ms. Lago is a very experienced public official. Τn 7 the Obama administration she served as Assistant 8 Treasury Secretary for International Markets 9 Development. She led the Office of International 10 Affairs at the Securities and Exchange Commission. She 11 was a top economic development official for New York 12 State and the city of Boston. So that makes her a 13 strong pick to lead the ITA.

14 Next up, Lisa Wang is nominated to serve as 15 Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Enforcement and 16 Compliance. Anybody who has followed our committee on 17 trade policy knows that we take a special interest in 18 vigorous trade enforcement. That is what this job is 19 all about, cracking down hard on trade cheats and 20 holding other countries to their commitments in order to 21 protect American jobs and give American workers and 22 businesses more opportunities to get ahead.

23 Ms. Wang also is highly experienced, particularly in 24 enforcement issues, having previously served as a senior 25 attorney in the Trade Enforcement and Compliance Office

at the Commerce Department. She also served as
 Assistant General Counsel in the Office of the U.S.
 Trade Representative, and has extensive experience in
 private practice. Strong trade enforcement is her area
 of legal expertise. These are roles with a clear focus
 that is very important to this committee.

Senator Crapo and I have talked often about the priority of focusing on creating good jobs and opportunities for American workers by getting trade done right. I am confident that Ms. Lago and Ms. Wang will have a lot of success. Both nominees have my full support. I urge the committee members on both sides of the aisle to support them as well.

And we will turn it over now to Senator Crapo for his opening remarks. And should there be any other members who wish to speak, that is appropriate now as well.

18 Senator Crapo?

OPENING STATEMENT OF HON. MIKE CRAPO, A U.S. SENATOR
 FROM IDAHO

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Senator Crapo. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
Today we are voting on two nominees who, if
confirmed, will play important roles in shaping U.S.
trade policy at the Department of Commerce. I intend to
support each.

9 Ms. Lago, in your opening statement at your 10 nomination hearing you noted that you believed in the 11 power of trade and investment to improve lives. I share 12 that view. If confirmed as Under Secretary of Commerce 13 for International Trade, I expect that you will be a 14 vigorous champion for expanding market access 15 opportunities that Americans need today. This administration can and must do more on this front. 16

Ms. Wang, you have extensive trade remedy experience. Our trade remedy laws are important tools to combat unfair trade. Despite a deferential standard of review, U.S. courts routinely find that the Department of Commerce's determinations are not supported by substantial evidence. This must change.

Our citizens rely on effective administration of
U.S. trade remedy laws. If confirmed as Assistant
Secretary for Enforcement and Compliance, I want you to

1 ensure that the Department of Commerce's trade remedy 2 determinations are of the highest quality. 3 Thank you for holding this executive session today, 4 Mr. Chairman, and I yield back to you. 5 The Chairman. Thank you, Senator Crapo. So once 6 again, it is our intent, because we wish to advance 7 these nominations, to vote on them, to reconvene in the 8 President's Room off the floor to have this vote, I 9 expect, at 11:30 a.m. And the committee will reconvene 10 in the President's Room. 11 Thank you, Senator Crapo. 12 [Whereupon, at 9:42 a.m., the meeting was recessed, 13 to reconvene at 11:30 a.m.] 14 15 The open executive session was reconvened, pursuant 16 to notice, on Wednesday, December 8, 2021, at 11:30 17 a.m., in Room S-216, The President's Room, U.S. Capitol, 18 Hon.
