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OPENING STATEMENT OF THE HON. WILLIAM V. ROTH, JR., A
 U.S. SENATOR FROM DELAWARE, CHAIRMAN, COMMITTEE ON
 FINANCE

5 The Chairman. The committee will please be in 6 order.

I am going to try to expedite this whole procedure,
if at all possible. We need 11. We have three separate
parts to this meeting, the organizational meeting, the
trade markup, and nominations markup.

11 So it is my hope that we can proceed on all three of 12 these, as I know the administration is very anxious for 13 us to move ahead with the nomination markup.

14 It is certainly critically important that we do 15 something about the Miscellaneous Trade and Technical 16 Corrections Act.

How many do we have now? We have eight. We needthree more.

19 Let me welcome all of you back today. Of course, 20 yesterday we did have a hearing, so this is not 21 technically the first meeting. But it is important that 22 we adopt the subcommittee and assignments.

There is a change in the subcommittee name. I think that involves yours, Senator from Alaska. Would you care to comment on that?

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Senator Murkowski. Thank you. I would move to
 change the name of the Subcommittee on Long Term Growth
 Debt and Deficit Reduction to the Subcommittee on Long
 Term Growth and Debt Reduction. The subcommittee was
 created in late 1980 at a time when Latin American debt
 and our deficit were significant problems.

I think it would be appropriate now to reflect today's realities if we changed the name to Long Term Growth and Debt Reduction, and take out deficit. We may have to put it back someday, but for the time being, at least, it is behind us, and I would so move.

12 The Chairman. We will withhold the vote on that13 until we get the quorum.

14 Senator Gramm. Mr. Chairman?

15 The Chairman. Yes, Senator Gramm.

16 Senator Gramm. Mr. Chairman, I just wanted to note 17 that the Banking Committee has submitted some questions 18 to a couple of our nominees. I intend to vote for them 19 today, but I do want to remind them that we are going to 20 expect them to answer those questions before these 21 nominations would reach the floor.

22 The Chairman. Duly noted.

Senator Murkowski. Mr. Chairman, I would also like
to welcome Senator Robb to the subcommittee.

25 The Chairman. Well, we appreciate that. As I

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1 mentioned yesterday, we are delighted to have the 2 distinguished Senator from Virginia as a member of this 3 committee. He has already made some significant 4 contributions, and we hope he enjoys this committee as 5 much as a majority have in the past. 6 Senator Robb. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 7 The Chairman. Thank you. 8 I know, on the Democratic side, We do have a quorum. 9 you have a conference. So what I would like to try and 10 do, we have the organizational meeting, which includes 11 the adoption of the subcommittee and assignments, 12 including the change that was mentioned on the 13 subcommittee name. 14 We also have the designation of committee members to serve on the Joint Committee on Taxation. 15 That is 16 myself, Senators Chafee, Grassley, Moynihan, and Baucus. 17 We have the designation of committee members to 18 serve as Congressional advisors on trade policy and negotiations. That is myself, Senators Chafee, Grassley, 19 Moynihan, and Baucus. 20 21 I would move the approval of these matters. 22 Senator Baucus. I second it. 23 The Chairman. Those in favor, signify by saying 24 aye. 25 [Chorus of ayes]

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The Chairman. Those opposed, nay.

[No response]

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3 The Chairman. The ayes have it. The organizational
4 meeting is adopted, as proposed.

5 I mentioned that we do have a trade markup of the 6 Miscellaneous Trade and Technical Corrections Act of 7 1999. This is essentially the same legislation as we 8 acted on last year. It is critically important that we 9 move ahead on this. I am hopeful that we can report this 10 bill.

11 I think maybe Senator Chafee has one comment that he12 would like to make.

13 Senator Chafee. Yes, Mr. Chairman. First of all, I 14 want to thank you and the Ranking Member for moving 15 quickly on this tariff bill. I did file an amendment, 16 but, since you wish to move quickly, I am not going to 17 offer the amendment. I want to say a few words, if I 18 might about the subject of U.S. marking laws on jewelry. 19 As we all know, U.S. law requires all imported goods to be marked with the country of origin. This law is 20 21 difficult to enforce with regard to jewelry, since 22 jewelry is so small. Customs allows tags or labels to be 23 used to mark imported jewelry, but they often fall off or 24 are removed.

25 Enforcing the marking law for jewelry is not a new MOFFITT REPORTING ASSOCIATES (301) 390-5150

problem. We have been struggling with this for some time. Last fall, when the new commissioner of Customs, Mr. Kelly, came before this committee, I brought this problem to his attention and followed up with a letter asking what we might do to help ensure enforcement of the marking laws.

7 Commissioner Kelly responded with some reasonable 8 suggestions. I believe that this problem, which is not 9 complicated, can be solved. I would like to work with 10 you, Mr. Chairman, and with the Ranking Member toward 11 that end, namely, solution of this problem that is 12 important to my State.

13 The Chairman. I would say to my distinguished 14 colleague, it is an important matter. We will be happy 15 to work with you in trying to find an equitable solution 16 to the matter.

Senator Chafee. I want to thank you very much, Mr.
Chairman. That thanks also goes to the Ranking Member
for his assistance in this. Thank you.

The Chairman. If there are no further comments.
Senator Baucus. No further comments. Thank you,
Mr. Chairman.

The Chairman. Those in favor of reporting out the
Miscellaneous Trade and Technical Corrections Act of
1999, please signify by saying aye.

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1 [Chorus of ayes]

2 The Chairman. Opposed, nay.

3 [No response]

4 The Chairman. The ayes have it. It is so reported. 5 Finally, we come to the nomination markup of the 6 five: Susan Esserman, to be Deputy U.S. Trade 7 Representative, with the rank of Ambassador; Timothy 8 Geithner, to be Under Secretary of the Department of Treasury for International Affairs; Gary S. Gensler, to 9 10 be Under Secretary of the Treasury for Domestic Finance; 11 Edwin M. Truman, to be Assistant Secretary of the 12 Treasury for International Affairs; and David C. 13 Williams, to be Inspector General for Tax Administration, 14 Department of Treasury. 15 Senator Baucus. Mr. Chairman, I move that the 16 committee favorably report the nominees. 17 Senator Chafee. I will second that. 18 The Chairman. Those in favor, signify by saying 19 aye. 20 [Chorus of ayes] 21 The Chairman. Opposed, nay. 22 [No response] 23 The Chairman. They are so reported. 24 I appreciate your being here.
