## REPORT

[To accompany H. J. Res. 327]

The Committee on Finance, to whom was referred the resolution (H. J. Res. 327) to permit articles imported from foreign countries for the purpose of exhibition at the Inter-American Trade Exposition, Fort Worth, Tex., to be admitted without payment of tariff, and for other purposes, having considered the resolution, report it back to the Senate without amendment and recommend that the resolution do pass.

The resolution follows the form and phraseology of numerous previous resolutions enacted by the Congress in connection with various international exhibitions and expositions held in the United States. It has long been the policy of the Congress to facilitate the participation of foreign countries in international exhibitions held in the United States by permitting articles intended for display at these exhibitions to be entered free of import duties and charges under safeguarding regulations of the Secretary of the Treasury.

The Inter-American Trade Exposition, an international exposition, is to be held at Fort Worth, Tex., from October 6 to 12, 1946, inclusive, by the Texas Pan-American Association, a nonprofit organization of businessmen of Latin-American nations and the United States of America formed to promote better trade understandings among those nations.

Other House joint resolutions identical in terms with House Joint Resolution 327 have passed the House and Senate without amendment and have had the approval of the Treasury Department.
