

TRUMP'S HEALTH CARE HIT LIST

February 2026

On July 4, 2025, congressional Republicans and Trump enacted the largest health care cuts in history, slashing over \$1 trillion from Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Already, hospitals and clinics are closing, workers are being laid off, patients are losing insurance coverage, and states are scrambling to fill budget gaps. New moms, kids, rural communities, people with disabilities, safety-net providers, and working families are feeling the strain. This digest summarizes the ongoing fallout and provides a conservative snapshot of the harms we've been able to uncover.

Where: Savannah, GA — Savannah Birth & Wellness Center

Impact: Maternity care closure

Why it matters: The closure ends nearly 40 years of local maternity care, reducing birthing options in the region and limiting access to out-of-hospital delivery services.

Effective: Late February 2026

[Los Angeles County to Close 7 Public Health Clinics Amid Funding Cuts](#)

Where: Los Angeles County, CA

Impact: Closure of 7 community health clinics

Why it matters: The closures will reduce access to preventive services, including STI testing, vaccinations, and other community health services, particularly for low-income residents.

Effective: Late February 2026


